Using a dry cleaner:

1. Apply liquid soap to any dirty or spattered areas with a clean and gentle sponge. This will aid in the cleaning, grime, and other minor stains.
2. Collars and cuffs are common trouble spots, so use your soft sponge to clean them frequently.
3. For larger dirt spots, dab the foam with more soapy water and rub in delicate circles.
4. Try not to add more water to a jacket than is necessary, as this can cause more harm than good.
5. Once the mark has been excluded, wipe the region dry with a hygienic, clean towel to remove any excess water.
6. Allow the leather to dry in a cool, dry area to remove any remaining moisture.
7. If necessary, use a tiny portion of leather mist, wax, or polish to revitalize your jacket.

The best approach to this cleaning solution is to avoid using a lot of moisture and rubbing too hard.

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
